News in Brief

If your New Year's Resolution is to get more involved in village life, we'd love to hear from you! There are currently 2 vacancies to become a Councillor, and these are opportunities to influence the decision-making of Wilberfoss.

In 2024 we focused on making visible improvements to the village. All the village bridges were painted and we carried out maintenance work to trees on the beck side. We installed picnic benches on open spaces and with the help of grant funding added a bus shelter to a bus stop on Main Street. We also increased the size of the litter bin at Church Bridge. We hope these improvements complement the hard work and dedication of other volunteer groups who enhance the village. We will continue our efforts in 2025 and if you have any ideas, do get in touch.

There may be an opportunity in the New Year for us to run a couple of first aid courses. Places will be limited but if you are interested, please message or email the Clerk in the first instance.

East Riding of Yorkshire Council are introducing a **Flood Warden Scheme**. This scheme will rely on volunteers in floodinghit communities being their eyes and ears, feeding information to East Riding of Yorkshire Council staff and the Parish Council on issues such as raising awareblockages, deploying flood signs and taking photographs. Flood Wardens are not responsible for decision-making, assisting residents in moving belongings or operating and repairing flood defences.

You don't have to be directly impacted by flooding to become a Flood Warden but if you or your home are vulnerable during heavy rainfall, this is a real opportunity to make connections with East Riding of Yorkshire Council staff. Use it as an opportunity to build relationships with those who can help. If you are interested, contact the Clerk for more information. Have a chat with others and get a group together.

The planning application for the Anaerobic Digestion Plan on Long Lane has been submitted. You'll find details on the East Riding of Yorkshire Council planning portal.

If you were impacted by black soot on 5th November, it is understood it came across the A1079, although it's not clear what was being burned. East Riding of Yorkshire Council Environmental Officers visited the site on the 6th but by then the fire was out and the debris had been cleared. If something like this happens again, it is imperative that it is reported immediately so that ERYC officers can act accordingly and in a timely manner.

The Parish Council will not be meeting in December so we would like to wish everyone a happy and safe Christmas.

We'll be celebrating 100 years of male voice singing in 'The Phil' throughout 2025 that will include our usual schedule of concerts in and around York, an appearance at the York Proms in Museum Gardens on Sunday 27th July, and also our main event of our Centenary year, performing at York's Barbican on Sunday 21st September where we'll be joined by our friends from other local choirs, a brass band, and we'll be raising money for our three 'partner charities.

The list appears shorter than previous lists as it is these items which are really, really urgently needed.








Children's Word Search




