News in Brief

Following huge interest, 3 **Accredited Community First Aid Courses** are being held in March, providing 24 people with a certificate in first aid.

The planning application for the proposed **Anaerobic Digestion facility** on Long Lane has been validated and access to the application can be found through a 'News' article on the Parish Council website. We have asked for a face-to-face meeting with the applicant, Engie. The deadline for comment is the 19th March 2025.

Community Consultation. We would like to install additional gated access to the amenity land on Storking Lane. The gate would be located close to the existing 30-mph speed sign on Storking Lane, offering safer access to this recreational space. It will avoid the need to walk the length of the verge into oncoming traffic to access through the existing gate. We have full support for the project from the ERYC Countryside Access Officer. anyone has any comment to make, please get in touch. In addition, the existing gate linking Middlecroft to the amenity land will be fitted with a plastic latch to reduce the noise when the gate swings shut.

ERYC have notified us of the possibility of funding to install new **bus shelters**. We have submitted an expression of interest for a new shelter at the Butcher's Shop. Funding is not guaranteed of course but we will keep the community posted.

Because of footpath limitations, the shelter would need to be open ended, like the one in front of the Community Centre.

Bus Services. Only the X47 bus service runs along Main Street. We wrote to East Yorkshire Buses last October to ask that either the X45 or X46 be routed through the village. Time constraints are a factor in only running the services along the A1079 corridor, so we've written to East Yorkshire Buses again to ask that either or both services run along Main Street eastbound only. This would at least offer residents better access to Pocklington and beyond. Entering and exiting the village from the left will only cause minimal changes to the schedule.

To add weight to our request, whether you use the bus service or not, please consider contacting East Yorkshire Buses. To make things easy, we've uploaded a template to the Parish Council website under 'News'. Simply print it, sign it and send it off!

The 8th May 2025 marks the 80th anniversary of VE & VJ Day. We have been alerted to a **funding pot of up to** £500 and can collaborate with community groups, so if you're planning to mark the occasion in some way, let's get our heads together!


