## **News in Brief**

Thank you to Cllrs Richard Rains, Colin Veitch and Stuart Savage who put two **picnic benches** together and got them to site in time for the summer holidays. You'll find one on open space next to the beck and the other on the amenity land off Storking Lane. We hope they provide greater opportunities to enjoy the outdoors.

Bus Shelter – We're coming closer to installing the bus shelter on Main Street. We've had the necessary 3 quotes and we're just dotting i's and crossing t's. In the main, the project will be funded by the Wilberfoss Quarry Fund from which we have secured £3,500.

Bridge Painting – Amy has moved on to painting Church Bridge and from their will paint Main Street bridge, before finishing at Butcher's Bridge. She hopes to complete the project by the end of the summer, weather permitting of course!

Despite several nudges in recent Newsletters, we are seeing an increasing number of boundary hedges obstructing pavements. We had hoped that a nudge would be enough, but we will shortly be forced to issue letters to those residents whose boundary hedges are causing an obvious obstruction. Failure to maintain a boundary hedge sufficiently could result in East Riding of Yorkshire Council taking action and if they have to resort to cutting it themselves, the property owner will be faced with a bill. We currently have 2 vacancies we can fill by co-option. One person has shown an interest, having attended a Parish Council meeting as an observer. It would be great to get back to full complement and if you are interested in being involved in a progressive Council, please drop the Clerk a line.

We would like to express our thanks to Wilberfoss in Bloom for the wonderful flower displays. The colour scheme is beautiful. Thank you for all your hard work throughout the year.

The Police & Crime Commissioner, Jonathan Evison, will be attending our Parish Council meeting in September. If you would like the Parish Council to bring anything to Jonathan's attention please email comments/suggestions to the Parish Clerk before the 15<sup>th</sup> August, when topics will be discussed at the August Parish Council meeting in preparation.

The East Riding of Yorkshire Council is trialling 20mph speed restriction zones. They has asked for nominations from rural and urban areas and will choose 4 sites. We will submit a proposal to cover the whole of Wilberfoss. Our request is not likely to be as strong as others in the East Riding but we are keen to try because we are aware of the increase in HGV traffic through the village. We will also approach East Riding of Yorkshire Council and ask for a weight restriction of Storking Lane.


