News in Brief

We're delighted to welcome Margaret Langstaff to the Parish Council. Margaret has lived in Wilberfoss since 1979 and has been involved in voluntary groups in the village over the years. She has an interest in the environment and is a beekeeper.

We still have a vacancy on the Parish Council so do get in touch if you're interested in making a difference in the community.

Bus Shelter – we have been informed that we do not need planning permission to erect a bus shelter so we will now move towards selecting a design and installing the shelter. Funding from the 2024 allocation of the Wilberfoss Quarry Fund will contribute towards the cost of the shelter.

You will see that the footbridge linking Beckside to Main Street has been painted. Amy has done a wonderful job and will now move on to the other 3 bridges in the village. Her schedule means she won't be back in Wilberfoss until mid-July but we anticipate that all 4 bridges will be painted by autumn.

We would like to say a huge thank you to all the volunteers who made this year's Elders Party such a success. Funds raised from the raffle on the day, from the D-Day 80 Community Fund and from two generous donations means that the ring-fenced funds we hold still have a very healthy balance. Becks and Stu Savage have confirmed they are delighted to commit to the event next year.

We are trialling a WhatsApp Channel to share news and information with community members who do not use social media. It allows us to share things that either can't wait for the next Newsletter or may include a helpful hyperlink. You'll find details on the village website. If we find the Channel is not of interest to the community, we will cancel it in the coming months.

By the time this Newsletter reaches you, the nesting season will be over. Cutting hedges in the nesting season is a grey area and we know that many would prefer to leave hedge cutting until July. Can we please ask all homeowners to check that their boundary hedges are not causing issues for pedestrians. We can count up to a dozen that are causing major issues. Individual letters will be sent to households in due course if action isn't taken so it would be hugely helpful if homeowners can now turn their attention to maintaining boundary trees and hedges. If you rent your home and your landlord is responsible for garden maintenance, please get in touch with them if the boundary hedge is encroaching. Thank you for your co-operation.

We are improving public open space areas with picnic benches. We hope that people will make use of them to enjoy the outdoors. If we witness persistent anti-social behaviour, the Parish Council will remove them. Please be respectful of neighbouring property owners and either take your litter home or find a bin.

We're delighted to share with you that we've had our first bit of success in our bid for Wilberfoss Community Centre to become more sustainable. £1,000 from the Hull & East Riding Charitable Trust, together with a generous personal donation, means we can replace lighting in the toilets, foyer, internal corridor and kitchen with microwave sensor lights that will automatically switch off when there's nobody in the area. An Energy Assessment of the building has identified a number of upgrades we can make to reduce our carbon footprint and we are busy filling in grant funding applications.
