# **News in Brief**

After 3 ½ years as a Parish Councillor, Michelle Wallis has tendered her resignation. We are sad to see Michelle go. Thankfully she has offered to continue in her role as Editor of the Newsletter. Thank you for all your hard work and dedication Michelle!

Wilberfoss Parish Council currently has 2 female and 5 male Councillors, with two vacancies to fill. If you are interested in getting more involved in village life, drop the Clerk a line.

Wilberfoss Parish Council no longer has a WhatsApp Channel. We saw it as a tool to disseminate urgent/useful information to those community members without social media but, having gathered only a very limited number of followers over the last 4 months, it appears that it is not required. We have taken the decision to cancel the mobile contract, saving electors £10 a month.

Our Chairman attended the drop-in session, provided by Engie, who have proposed the siting of an Anaerobic Digestion facility on Long Lane. With concerns about the increase in traffic on the A1079, the potential for unpleasant odours and fears about an increase in houseflies, together with the risk of pollution of the local watercourse and the site's proximity to existing Anaerobic Digestion facilities, the Parish Council is currently opposed to the development. The Parish Council website will shortly be upgraded so that it is fully accessible to those with certain disabilities. Please bear with us during the upgrade.

Reports of antisocial behaviour in the village are very disappointing. Wilberfoss has been a wonderful community to live in without such behaviour for many, many years. We are in touch with PC John Day at Pocklington Police Station, who will carry out an intervention if necessary. We would encourage community members to report incidents they witness to the Police non-emergency number 101 so that records can be kept and offenders identified.

In a bid to cut costs, East Riding of Yorkshire Council will no longer routinely check and fill salt bins. If you see that a salt bin needs filling, please ring the East Riding of Yorkshire Council switchboard on 01759 393939 or go online to request a refill.

There is currently a consultation to designate the Yorkshire Wolds as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. To have your say, the nearest drop-ins are at Pocklington Scout Hut on the  $13^{th}$  November from 12.00 pm – 6.00 pm and Millington Village Hall on  $14^{th}$  February from 12.00 pm – 7.00 pm

Main Street, Wilberfoss will be closed to through traffic from approximately 10.40 am to 11.20 am on Remembrance Sunday  $10^{th}$  November.

## **New Bus Service**

East Yorkshire Buses is excited to announce a major improvement to our services connecting Market Weighton, Pocklington, and York and reintroducing our service to Dunnington.

Starting on **11 November 2024**, the current X46 and X47 services will be complemented by the new X45 route, which provides more frequent buses throughout the day. With the introduction of the X45, we will now offer three buses per hour during the day between Market Weighton, Pocklington, and York.

The new X45 will run from Market Weighton to York, following the existing X46 route, but will travel through Dunnington, restoring a muchrequested link for the community to Pocklington and York. This enhancement will provide Dunnington residents with reliable and direct access to these areas, as well as convenient, seamless connections to Driffield via a newly revised 145 service, which will run hourly during the day from the 11th of November. The improved 145 service is provided with financial support from East Riding of Yorkshire Council, funded by the U.K. Government.

#### Remembrance Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> November

This is a very special occasion which gives us all the opportunity to gather together to remember those who gave their lives for us in past conflicts. If you wish to process to the Cenotaph, please gather at Church ready to process at 10.45 am, or alternatively please gather at the Cenotaph on Main Street. There will be 2 minutes of silence at 11.00. Those who remain in Church will have a concurrent service conducted by Peter Green. The procession, led by Rev Simon Pritchard, will return to Church for the remainder of the service.

#### **Christmas Services**

Please note that the Christmas Carol Service will be held on 15th December at 6.00 pm. The village School Choir will be performing and, if last year was anything to go by, this will be an amazing experience. The Crib Service will be held on 24th December at 4.00pm and all children are encouraged to dress up as a character from the Nativity story to help set the scene. There will **not** be a Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve at Wilberfoss Church, however there will be a Midnight Mass service at Catton Church starting at 11.30 pm. The Christmas Day service at Wilberfoss Church will be held at the earlier than usual time of 10.00 am.

## Safeguarding - the action the Church takes to promote a safer culture within the Church.

The Church is open every day from approximately 10.00 am until 3.00 pm for you to find peace, a quiet place for prayer, borrow a book or just to enjoy the beautiful surroundings. The Ministry Team and all front-line volunteers have been on training courses regarding the important issue of safeguarding, following the relevant national legislation and guidance. The front-line volunteers include those who welcome worshippers and distribute hymn books and liturgy, read the lessons, lead the intersessions, invite you to take communion or to come forward for a blessing. All Church led activities have at least one person who has their safeguarding certification and has been cleared by the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS).

The very popular Church Craft Fair will be held on 16<sup>th</sup> November. 


