News in Brief

You will see that in anticipation of replacing the litter bin at Church Bridge, East Riding of Yorkshire Council have provided us with a green wheelie bin. When they have a stock of casings, the wheelie bin will be covered and the smaller bin removed. If this smaller bin is fit for purpose they may re-purpose it but as it is made of fibreglass and has been in situ for many years, if may break on removal.

Councillors welcomed Jonathan Evison, the Police Crime Commissioner, to our meeting this month. He gave us an hour of his time and the meeting was very insightful. An appraisal of that meeting has been added as an appendix to the Minutes of September's meeting. The Minutes can be found online on the Parish Council website (where you can access the links to a number of Humberside Police schemes) and on the Parish Council noticeboards on Main Street and Willow Park Road.

We are re-visiting the idea of investing in a Speed Indicator Device (SID) and may partner with a neighbouring Parish Council. We have been assured that a funding opportunity, set up by the Humberside Police & Crime Commissioner, is still accessible and it could fund 50% of the purchase of a SID.

As a Parish Council we are turning our attention to setting the Precept for 2025/2026. The Precept is a sum of money collected from each household in the village and administered by the Parish Council, who have powers and duties to spend it to manage and enhance the village.

If you are interested in getting more involved in village life, we still have a vacancy for a Parish Councillor.

Thank you to householders who have cut their boundary hedges. Many of those who were identified as being problematic have been cut back. There are still some that are causing an obstruction, but we hope that this is simply due to holiday commitments and that they will be addressed over the coming weeks.

Please check that your boundary hedge is not obstructing footpaths or highways. Thank you.

A quiet room is available for one-to-one help and our Digital Champions, Bob and Ian, will make themselves available at these sessions to help people.


We hope that those who came to the Open Meeting will share their experiences with others so that their family, friends and neighbours will have the confidence to reach out. You just might learn something new!


